Welcome to our third newsletter for the term, our school community has been focused on our Units of Inquiry learning and celebrating the sunshine during our outdoor learning times. Please make sure you read on to find out more about the learning opportunities that our students are engaging in.



3 way - conferences

Today an email and Seesaw message was sent to all families in regards to our upcoming 3-way conferences being held in week 10. These conferences are a great opportunity to meet with classroom teachers with your child to discuss their learning progress as well as help develop some further learning goals for the year ahead.

3-way conferences allow for students to have a voice in their learning. They help build and strengthen home/school relationships so that students can see their parents working in partnership with their teachers to support their learning.

School learning

Our Reception and Year 1 students have remained focused on their Who We Are unit and have really settled into the spoils of school life. Buddy classes have engaged together to ensure that the younger students have familiar faces to locate during the day and as the term has progressed their confidence has grown and their personalities are shining through during play times. The Year 1 and 2 classes are learning about caring for different places through their Sharing the Planet learning and lots of research has been undertaken with learning how to create an information report and with mapping skills in numeracy.

Room 19 and 9 (Year 2 and 3) are challenged by looking at how people make decisions with fairness and equity and this has brought about many discussions about our values and how they differ from school to home to ensure a harmonious community. The Junior Primary classes and the Year 3/4 teams all engaged in an RAA incursion which helped us learn about keeping ourselves safe and systems that are used in the community. Rooms 12 and 7 have investigated systems that we use at school and at home and many families would have engaged in discussions at home about systems that help us stay organised.

The upper primary teams have been very busy using their research and inquiry skills to learn about the varied nature of our natural world. They have been investigating various parts of the world and their features. The 4/5 classes have just started their unit into digital systems, we are sure that lots of inquiry will be occurring in the lessons.

Across the whole school our UR Strong learning has continued and students have been using monthly focuses to help develop their areas of friendship. March has seen students focus on Courage.



On Thursday morning during Week 8 our students gathered together to celebrate and farewell the wonderful and talented Sensei Gunawan. Amanda Gunawan has taken a year's leave from BPS after winning a position interstate with the Japanese Embassy. Through her time as our Japanese teacher at BPS, Sensei has been an integral part of lots of school projects and activities to develop the students' appreciation and skills related to language acquisition and learning. Amanda Gunawan worked tirelessly to help build the school's Japanese Garden, prepare and support students during the Hiragana competitions, BluEarth sports day activities and the CBCA Shadow Judging competition. Sensei will be missed by many of our students and staff and we look forward to hearing about her new and exciting role.



IB Update

Our whole school Unit of Inquiry has been focused on the Transdisciplinary Theme WHO WE ARE, and the Central Idea created by a collaborative staff wellbeing team in 2023 is 'Choices affect well-being'. All year levels have been able to engage in our new Friendology program 'UR Strong' and this has seen students already implementing the language in classrooms and play spaces. The whole school approach through a friendship strategy has seen staff upskilled in the curriculum and our next steps are to offer programs to the parents and families of our students.

Each year level team has been able to co-create their own lines of inquiry based on the needs of the cohort, all classes are however looking at wellbeing literacy as our DfE Wellbeing survey identified that as an area of need to be supported to build community and belonging within our school. The Receptions and Year 1's are focusing on 'caring for others'. Year 1 and 2 focus on 'how to maintain positive relationships'. Our Upper Primary teams have used Japanese terms to underpin their learning which is wonderful to see the integration of our language learning into the lessons. Year 2/3s are learning about the japanese concept of 'Moai - もあい' (Supportive relationships) the Year 3 and 4 cohort are looking into - 'Kaizen かいぜん' (Process of continual improvement), the Year 4 and 5 team Omoiyari おもいやり (Empathy) and our senior students in Year 5 and 6 - Oubaitori おうばいとうり (Embracing our uniqueness).

Our classes have been busy each week developing their wellbeing literacy and developing friendship skills that will enhance their personal ability to name and notice both positive and negative relationship behaviours and being able to articulate their needs to their peers and when seeking support in the yard and classrooms. We really think that this program and our linked learning is going to support our students as they move through schooling and beyond.

Seniors Uniforms

Blackwood Primary School has a proud tradition of presenting our final year students with two additional uniform items. The students co-create the design for the back of their Senior jumpers and the teachers decide on the design of the t-shirts. This year we have reverted back to BPS tradition and opted for red shirts for the senior students. There were a number of reasons behind this decision and discussions took place between teachers and leadership around the best design available for us and our school community. Many of you would have been aware that our Uniform supplier changed last year and this meant that the 2023 design and make was no longer available. Teachers had expressed concern that often student behaviour and demeanor was impacted once the students put on their seniors uniform and that it appeared to be linked to the superiority they felt in the alternate colours. In an effort to continue to build whole school community and belonging, make it easier to spot our students while out in the community and in the yard, the teachers requested that the tops align more with the current uniform and already we have seen the benefits. With all areas of change in our lives (especially in regard to the items of clothing we wear day in and out) there will always be commentary and opinions and we welcome feedback as this helps us make more informed decisions in the future. The leadership team requests that any feedback be sent via email to the school so that we have it formally documented to feedback to our supplier. In the meantime it has been wonderful to see all students at BPS look smart and well presented at the beginning of each school day and there are lots of uniform options available that help students move and participate in learning and play throughout the day.

SAPSASA Diving and Swimming

Congratulations to Lawson Reynolds who represented our school at the State Diving Championships at the SA Aquatic and Leisure Centre at Marion on Monday of Week 5. Lawson came 1st in the 11 Year Old Springboard and 4th in the 10-12 Year Old Mixed Synchro Event.

On Friday of Week 5 we had 8 students compete at the Combined City South and Southern Heights Swimming Carnival at the Marion Outdoor Pool. The students who represented our school where Kenzie L, Kawin, Nima, Vihani, Tamika, Lawson, Daniel and Mia A. Well done to all of these students and congratulations to Kawin who came 3rd in the Ten Year Old Backstroke.
